--Apiary Report from Dave: 3 hives survived the winter and doing very well.

--Honey House Report from Kerriann: Kids Projects planned for CCF with posters and signs that will mark all the jobs honeybees do in the hive. 7:20 Dave introduced Fran Fowler who spoke of the healing powers of Raw Honey. She had references for Allergies, Arthritis, Infections and more studies are conducted each day. Dave noted he uses bee stings for his Arthritis with good results New studies include bee venom uses fighting MRSA a staph condition resistant to antibiotics and use with Acupuncture needles for added effects. 7:40 Dave spoke on the Indispensable NUC. The NUC traditionally has 5 frames, there are Baby NUCS are smaller with 2-3 frames and shorter in length generally for queen production. Commercial Beekeepers have 1 NUC per 10 hives and for the Backyard beekeeper 1 NUC per 2 hives. Benefits: 1) used to split hives, 2) Used to build up weak hives with more bees. 3) helps with untimely queen problems to make a new queen. 4) used for extra brood and expand operations, 5) used for swarm collection, 6) Producing and selling NUCS for income. NUCS expand quickly and require more attention to make sure they are fed and have room. They can be susceptible to infestations because the defenders are smaller.
