-Ralph White and Dori Kline are here to introduce you to their Top Bar Hives. They recommend, David Toht's "Backyard Home Steading" for self-sufficiency and guidance on Top Bar Hives. Top Bars can be vertical (Ware Hives) and like the Longstroth they can use frames without foundation. The bees build their comb from the top down but unlike the Langstroth hive the frames are all horizontal eliminating building a tower of supers. A horizontal frame hive is found in Kenya and Tanzania and stack up in the hive.

-Dori noted that the Top Bar hive can be as long as you need it to be, it can house 2 hives in one structure when you block the center with a follower board between the 2 hives. She noted that you can add a super to the Top Bar if you wish for extra honey. When the bees build our the top bar each frame has honey on top, next pollen and brood at the bottom of the frame, they then build frames of pure honey (honey strip) and the queen will not cross that frame eliminating the use of a queen excluder. When you examine your hive you only disturb one or two frames at a time keeping the bees calm and busy in the hive vs the Langstroth where you expose the whole hive to sun and wind etc. Since there is no super there is no heavy lifting. The bottom of the Top Bar can be screened in just like Langstroth to check for mites and can be closed for the winter if needed.

-Bee space is important in the Top Bar Hive and make sure the bees do not cross comb and get out of alignment.

Pro Top Bar:Con Top Bar:cheap and easy to buildcross combinga knife is the only tool you needbroken comb

no heavy lifting not always a universal size

you can produce comb honey hard to move because of size and shape

lot of wax to work with cannot use honey extractors; frames have no structure

easy to cut drone comb must use package or swarm to fill with bees

NOTE: to extract honey from a Top Bar use paint strainer over a bucket and smash the comb to drain the honey into the bucket or you can keep the comb intact with honey in jar for extra goodness.
