--7:03 Amy Vu;(amy.Vu@UFI.Edu) our State Specialized Program Extension Agent—Apiary Honeybee Research and Extension Laboratory, Department of Entomology and Nematology University of FL. She is here tonight with Louie, her shadow student. (See entire video on website) Topic: Honeybee Research and Extension Laboratory

Amy has been at UF for 6.5 years and travels the state to meet all beekeepers. She puts out Two Bees in a Podcast with Dr Ellis and they have 400,000 listeners around the world.

The UF Honeybee Research and Extension Lab (HBREL) is a \$4.5 mil facility. --There are 5,000 Registered Beekeepers with over 677,000Colonies and Backyard Beekeepers have 33,759 Colonies in FL. There are 619,641 Colonies for Commercial Beekeepers. And in Clay and Duval we have 544 Beekeepers. In 2021 FI produced 8.8 million gallons of honey. Florida is the top 5 Beekeeping states next to CA, MI, Dakota and NY. --Varroa and their viruses are the major reason for Honeybee decline. Nutrition is the other reason: Dr Ellis recommends one deep for brood with one medium box for nectar storage and then one super for your harvest.

If you have questions for UF you can funnel them through Cassidy Dossin (cdossin@ufl.edu) to the Honeybee Extension Education Team (HBEET). There are many honeybee courses thanks to Dr Cameron Jack: Master Beekeeper online, Beekeeper Short Course, Bee College (2day) revolves around Florida 2x per year. Two Bees in a Podcast where you can send in questions for Dr Ellis and Amy. Social Media, Face Book and Twitter are also used. UF has public tours once a month, email for dates and times.

8:10—Presidents Report: Dragon flies are dangerous to new queens esp. in the Summer. We are in the dearth now, if you haven't harvested your honey do it now..

--<u>Hive Management</u>: Keep monitoring for Small Hive Beetles (SHB). It is swarm season monitor your hives! Monitor and treat for SHB they go wild in the summer and for Varroa when you have 3 mites per 100 Bees. Feed your colonies if you notice lack of pollen and bees getting cranky. Monitor for split signs and be sure to feed new splits

8:20-- Apiary Report: 6 (10) Frame Hives and 20 NUCS.
