-- 7:10 Dave opened the meeting with Pledge of Allegiance and welcomed 3 New Members and 2 Guests tonight.

-- Treasurer Report: \$26,600.16 accepted

-- President Report: Bees are still Swarming, check your traps

-- We are in a Dearth now so feed your bees until Fall Foliage starts

-- Keep Monitoring for Small Have Beeles and Varroa Mites and treat. Mites are at peak levels.

-- Hives will decrease in size now because of decrease in pollen and nectar.

-- Honey should be extracted now, if not done. Feeding should be 1:1 Sugar water

-- If you do your splits now till next Spring, it is best to use Mated Queens vs having the hive make their own queens because of an increase in Dragon Flies.

-- <u>Apiary Report</u>: 4 Langstroth, 29 NUCS between Apiary #1 & #2, 1 Top Bar not in use. Our Swarm Trap is collecting a swarm and will be checked this coming week.

-- <u>What's Blooming</u>: Crepe Myrtle (pollen, no nectar) Bottle Brush, Sweet Almond, Cabbage Palms

-- <u>Mentor Report</u>: Ray reports we have 15 Mentors. At our last Mentor Mtg we extracted honey with 2 extractors.

-- <u>Membership Coor:</u> Susan Repots we have 5 new members tonight making a total of 191 members. 7:30 Guest speaker tonight, Jason Gill, a Practice Representative from Kingsley Chiropractic Clinic. Speaking on the benefits of spinal adjustments and correct alignment. They offer a \$40 special offer including X-rays and therapy for a first-time visit. He stayed to evaluate several members backs with a computer program that notes the weak or painful areas. He has offered to return every quarter for evaluations if members would like.

7:45 Dave Sieruta was next and discussed the process of Winterizing your hives. Feeding your bees during the winter will help stimulate the Queen to begin laying esp. when the Red Maple trees begin to bloom Dec/Jan. It takes 6 weeks for a hive to build and grow. Plan ahead. Treat for SHB and

Varroa Mites. Dave notes he treats his hives for Varroa 4x/year Jan, April, July, Oct. with Oxalic Acid. is available in vapor and strips now. Whatever treatment you use be sure to read the directions, some can be used with Supers on, and others will contaminate your honey such as Apavar. Some Apiaries are noting that the bees may become immune to the Rx.

--If you make splits do so in JULY/Sep to have the hive healthy for Winter. If you do your split, it is recommended by Dave and others that you buy a Mated Queen for your split rather than waiting for the bees to make a queen. Dragon flies are plentiful in the Summer/Fall and many queens never return from their mating flight and it will get your hive growing sooner. Also, leave the Fall honey in the hive for the bees to overwinter.

**Remember: feed & Mite check.
