--PRESIDENTS REPORT: Plan for Pot luck in June. The CCBA will provide Fried Chicken, drinks and service ware and members as always, bring your best covered dish.

-- May is a busy month continue and treat SHB and Mites. Do your Mite treatments, esp. with the warm damp weather coming. You can treat mites with Oaxcilic Acid, 4 GMs now is approved with supers on. Most all other treatments need the supers off to avoid the honey absorbing the treatment. --Don't forget to feed your colonies. And prepare to make your slits to avoid swarming if you have

queen cells present. Bees are Swarming so put out your Swarm Traps now.

-- APIARY Report: we have 2 full Langstroth Hives now and 16 NUCS with 11 Castles and our Top Bar has no bees at present. Next month we will have NUCS for sale by lottery.

-- What's Blooming: Formosa trees, Wild Flowers, Sunflowers...

-- MENTOR COORDINATOR: Ray is our Mentor Coordinator please see him if you would like a mentor. Last month we had 30 attending the Sat meeting, REMEMBER now its is at 9AM due to heat. --MEMBERSHIP CHAIR: 184 Paid members.

-- Q: are there any problems with bees around power lines, A: No.

-- Q. Can members use our new Observation hive: A: Yes. See Dave for info.

-- Note: Dave announced that we now have 2 Extractors that can be borrowed for members. Tthey are stored at Dave's home, check with him for dates.

-- DEMO of Dave's homemade Swarm Basket of a pool pole and small bucket and Swarm vacuum of shop vac and small vented basket and 5 gal bucket. (see video at ClayBees.com)

-- John Boeckstiegel has a new version of his Oaxcilic acid fogger for sale.

-- Q: Cheryl Parish asked why her bees are not using her super and are going to honey bind her hive body. A: Many offered that she needs to wax her super foundations and remove her queen excluder to entice the bees up to the super, then replace the excluder when they start using the super.

-- Q: When is the Honey Flow over. A: Depends on the amt of rain but usually the end of JUNE is a good time to harvest your honey. As long as the honey frame is 80% full of capped honey.

-- Q: When do you feed the bees. A: During the Dearth, you should stop feeding when the bees stop using the sugar water, and now with the honey flow on you will not need to feed.

-- Q: Does anyone have a source for 50# of honey that is cheaper. A: some stores/feed places sell 2nd hand sugar that is not fit for human consumption but fine for the bees.

-- Q: How much does the honey super weigh. A: Average super can weigh 45-50# depending on number of frames. A 5 Gal bucket can weigh 60#.

-- Q: A cherry tree has many swarms in it, how do we set up a trap. A: The box you have is fine, use a 1 inch entrance. Come to the Mentor Meeting Sat and see it and Dave will bring some old wax to use in the trap along with small amts of attractant: Swarm Commander, Bee Rustler, Lemon Grass. The trap can be approx. 20 ft away any height. Bees can travel 3-5 miles to forage but for a new hive they usually move out of the immediate area they came from.

-- Good time to register your bees with Mosquito control for spraying season and remember they will treat ponds or lakes for mosquitoes without spraying or cost.

-- Q: Where can we find bees. A: Hives and More, we also will be selling NUCs for \$60 next month and members can also sell .
