- --If you do splits it is recommended you buy a mated queens vs letting the hive make their own because it is Dragon Fly season and they will kill your queens. Also be sure your queens are laying well this time of year.

 - --- APIARY: We have 5 Langstroth, 14 NUCS and 1 Top Bar Hive.
 - --What's Blooming: Spanish Thistle, Golden Rain Tree, Black Eye Susan, Mexican Clover and Mexican Sunflower.
- 7:20 Mentor Report: Last Mentor Meeting cancelled due to Hurricane Ian. Dave took 3 UF Students through the Apiary at the request of Dr Cameron Jack and Cross Middleton. They also were able to help capture 2 Swarms.

-Membership Chair: Thanks to all paying 2023 dues now. We are nearing 200 members; 8 signed after the Beginner Bee Class and 3 after the Symposium. In 10 years, our dues have not increased. 7:30 Frank Gianino presented Mead Making. Mead is the oldest beverage and dates to 8000 BC. Grapes were cultivated much later, and beer needed heat to coach the sugars from the barley. Yeast changes to Ethyl Alcohol and Carbon Dioxide. The Yeast determines the sweetness of the Mead. It was preserved crops and reduce the bulk of the grapes. 5 GAL of Mead needs 14 pounds Raw Honey and clean water. KEEP EVERYTHING CLEAN or risk bacteria infecting your Mead.
