--President's Report.

Dave thanked Sue G, Dorie, Ric Hopkin, Michael Preston, Kevin Fields, Jeff and Amy Fields, Richard and Sharon Robinson for all their help at the Jax Honeybee festival.

Monitor for SHB and Mites and treat as needed. 3/100 mites is a 30% infestation-TREAT. You can use Powder Sugar or alcohol wash or Dawn wash.

Still OK to split but it would be better to buy a queen vs rearing your own due to an increase in Dragonflies this time of year. Splits also help reduce mite and SHB populations with splits. Feed your splits. Fall Nectar Flow is starting.

Swarms are still possible check your Swarm Traps and feed your swarms and NUCS till Sep ----Apiary Report: 2 Langstroth hives, 14 NUCS and 1 Top Bar Hive

--What's Blooming: Spanish Thistle, Golden Rod, Bottle Brush, Swee Almond &, Loquat.

-- Membership Chair Susan W.: Report on the Stingers helping at the Honeybee Fest. They have 11 members now from Clay Duval and St Johns. They harvested 30 bottles of honey and sold them at the Master Gardeners Plant sale. NOTE: Members who paid in Sep are paid for 2024.

--Mentor Report Ray V.:17 folks at Sat meeting, they worked the Apiary hives.

7:30 Speaker this evening is Dave Sieruta on Treating Mite infestation.

--3-4 times per year he uses aerosol Oxalic Acid, there is also Powdered Sugar that Ray uses every month esp. JUN – NOV. Neither treatment kills the bees. Also, an experimental caulking gun type of treatment is out to place around the hive box but not approved in FL. You test each month and treat when you reach 3% mites or 3/100 bees. 90% of the Mites are in the cells so treating more than once is recommended. Treat in Spring, FEB / MAR, and at the end of Summer/ OCT which protects the hive over winter. Dave treats again in JAN as the bees start to grow the hive. Check the bees to ensure your hives stay healthy, if robbing or foreign bees enter the hive Mites can still be spread. So do Oxalic Acid treatment and the next is Formic Acid interchanging them. *If you use the chemical treatments remember they cannot be used with your Supers on it will affect your honey. If you have Hygienic bees, they clean the Mites off other bees but if something happens to the queen you will no longer raise Hygienic bees unless you replace that queen with another Hygienic queen. Mites do not like Spearmint or Wintergreen, and they can be used in your Brood Booster feedings.
