-- <u>Treasurers Report</u> \$18,087.01 accepted.

--7:13 Presidents Report:

--Hive management: Beware of Small Hive Beetles, Treat with Beetle Grease (Recipe on the web site) and hives out in the full sun discourage SHB. Dave has started adding Brood Booster 1 Cup/5 Gal of Sugar Water. (recipe on web site) You can add Wintergreen (SHB), Spearmint(Mites) or Tee Tree (Nosema) or Lemon Grass to the mixture.

--The Fall Honey Flow has started with Goldenrod, Spanish Thistle, Asters, Sweet Almond and Bottle Brush blooming. You can harvest your Fall Honey but most leave it for the bees to winter over which is cheaper that sugar water.

--Start feeding your hives now through Winter when Red Maple blooming.

--If you do splits it is recommended you buy a mated queens letting the hive make their own because it is Dragon Fly season and they will kill your queens. Also be sure your queens are laying well this time of year. Dadant and Skip Blackwell have queens until OCT.

--APIARY: We have 5 Langstroth with supers & 14 NUCS with 11 Castles and 1 Top Bar Hive.

--Mentor Report: Last Mentor Meeting we had 12 members present. We lost 1 NUC.

--Membership Chair: Folks can start paying next year's dues now; \$15 per voting member. 7:26—This month we have Diane Spoden, one of our members working on her Master Beekeeper from UF and she is becoming qualified as a Welch Honey Judge. She will present "How to Prepare for Honey Judging." Her handouts will pe on the web site and we will have copies. She added the "Black Jar" info also. We will have a honey judging at our Symposium OCT 8.

She got her ideas from out last Seminar and is in apprenticeship with Ray. Her presentation is for those who want to enter their honey in Oct or in any judging. When you win a judging is it great bragging rights for your honey sales. It is fascinating how different honey is from beekeepers. Black Jar is for those who don't want to go through the trouble of bottling. Any jar will do with a fair amount of honey in it. It is placed in a black bag and will by judged on taste alone.

Preparing you jar requires 1# plastic or glass jar. Most judging require 3 jars for each category being judged, they must be clean and dried with microfiber. Any other cloth will leave lint that can be seen. The moisture of the honey must be 18.6 or under. Jacksonville Honey Fair will have judging, check jaxbees.com. UF has honey judging at every class also.
